John 13:34

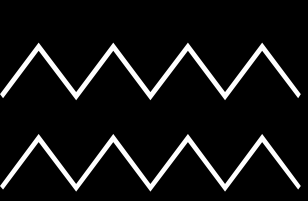
Love one another as I have loved you.

Strategy 1: Model It

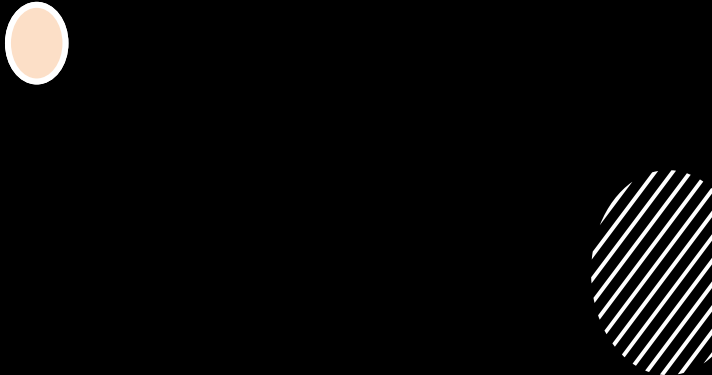
Values are caught more than taught.

Be consistent and authentic in behavior.

Interactive: Share ways you've seen Christian values in action.



Strategy 2: Embed It in Daily Life



Use stories, prayer, and reflection.

Relate events to biblical teachings.

Interactive: In pairs, brainstorm **ways to reinforce one value** at home, school or in community

Strategy 3:

Activate It Through Service

Teach

Teach values by doing — service and outreach.

Compassion

Live compassion, kindness, and justice.

Suggest

Interactive: Suggest local issues where we / our young people could live out Christian values.
