CONFERENCE DETAILS

The European Institute of Family Life Education / Institution European d'Education Familiale (EIFLE/IEEF) in association with the Natural Family Planning Teachers Association of Ireland (NFPTAI) are hosting a conference in Knock on Saturday 4th October 2025.

The title of the conference is: Family, Life and Education: Our Hope for the Future. The conference will focus on:

- The importance of cherishing the family as the foundation for a stable society.
- The importance of respecting life from conception to natural death.
- The importance of ensuring a holistic education and lifelong learning to nurture the growth and development of all members of the family intellectually, psychologically, socially and spiritually.

Protecting the role of Christian values in family life and education ensures the future wellbeing of our society and speakers are chosen for their expertise, knowledge and experience of living, teaching and learning that God's way is nature's way.

The venue for the conference is Knock House Hotel www.knockhousehotel.ie on the grounds of Knock Shrine www.knockshrine.ie. The conference will begin with mass in The Apparition Chapel at 8am followed by presentations divided into three sessions on Family, Life and Education.

2. The European Institute of Family Life Education /Institution Europèen d'Education Familiale

The conference on Saturday 4th October 2025 is part of the annual general meeting of EIFLE/IEEF that takes place over the weekend of Friday 3rd to Sunday 5th October in Knock. Members of EIFLE/IEEF come together from as far north as Russia and as far south as Malta for a meeting once a year to share scientific updates and to collaborate on research and training projects in education and fertility care. The meeting location varies from year to year and this year the meeting is taking place in Ireland.

EIFLE / IEEF is a multi-denominational umbrella organisation that was founded in 1992 in Grenoble, France to promote the values of family, life and family-life education and, in particular, the study of fertility and its regulation by natural means in Europe and beyond. EIFLE / IEEF accredits courses in fertility awareness according to evidence-based standards in the areas of medical-science, anthropology, ethics and pedagogy.

The institute produces guidance on sex and relationship education in a way that embraces and promotes positive family-oriented values. The group is involved in research in the field of fertility awareness and fertility care. EIFLE / IEEF member associations are found throughout Europe and provide a variety of services, courses and supports to the couple and the family. 3. The Natural Family Planning Teacher Association of Ireland

The NFPTAI (Natural Family Planning Teachers Association of Ireland) was established in 1988 by Dr Anna Flynn and Nurse Wynn Worthington who also established the NFPTA in the UK. Dr Anna and Wynn developed the course in the sympto-thermal double check method of natural family planning (NFP) run by the NFPTAI and NFPTA, which are now accredited to the EIFLE / IEEF standards.

The NFPTAI also provides instructors, couples, health professionals and teachers in Ireland with the most up-to-date information and scientific research relating to NFP and fertility awareness. The NFPTAI strives to bring understanding of the value of NFP as a safe, reliable, easy-to-use method of family planning to as wide an audience as possible.

Sinéad Strong:

Sinéad grew up in Omagh and now lives in Castleblayney, Co Monaghan. Sinead studied International Politics and Business at the University of Ulster and has worked in Business management and is now a full-time stay-at-home mum to 7 children and is married to John.

In 2015, Sinead saw the challenges both she and her friends were facing bringing their children up in the Catholic faith. She saw a need for somewhere mothers could go for support and encouragement in their demanding roles as wives and mothers as well as growing in their faith through sharing their experiences. Sinead felt called to start a group with the simple aim for mothers to get together to pray, learn and talk about their faith. Catholic Mothers Ireland (CMI) started with a small group of friends meeting every few months and through their prayers and enthusiasm it has now developed to become an All-Ireland organisation at the heart of a vibrant schedule of Catholic events, breathing new life into faith across the country. From nationwide retreats to major national gatherings, CMI is creating opportunities for families, parents, and communities to reconnect with their catholic roots. With a network of over 500 women and a growing presence, CMI's events are uniting women and families in faith, prayer, and fellowship. A cornerstone of CMI's mission is its series of retreats, held throughout the year in all four provinces. Drawing an average of 50 attendees per retreat, these events offer mothers the chance to reflect, pray, and build meaningful connections. CMI also has a prominent presence at major national events hosting information and membership stands at gatherings such as the Divine Mercy Conference and the All-Ireland Rosary Rally. CMI has grown into a nationwide movement dedicated to supporting women and families through prayer, education, and community engagement.

CMI's events and initiatives are redefining the role of Catholic women in Ireland, fostering connections that nurture both individuals and entire families. Patrick McCrystal

Patrick McCrystal qualified in Pharmacy from Queens University, Belfast in 1987. In 1993, he ceased dispensing the contraceptive pill and other drugs, due to their abortifacient action. As a result, he was unemployed in his profession for three years. In 1997 Patrick was appointed Executive Director of **Human Life International** (Ireland). Patrick is married to Therese and they have nine children aged 21 yrs down. Patrick and Therese featured on EWTN in a documentary in 2004 and his life was profiled by Shalom World TV's 100-Fold series in 2021. Patrick is also an avid beekeeper.

Human Life International was founded by Fr Paul Marx in 1981 as a Catholic, pro-life movement to proclaim the "Culture of Life" and oppose the "Culture of death." HLI Ireland operates from the Guadulupe Centre in Knock. Patrick and his colleagues conduct speaking tours, conferences, Catholic activism formation courses, pregnancy information projects, marriage renewal seminars, rosary and Holy Face prayer campaigns, all-night vigils, nationwide advertising, newsletters, printing of Catholic resources and run two shops in Knock. Patrick and his HLI colleagues speak at youth events and conferences on marriage, faith and life themes. Their motto is "For an Ireland where God is First, Life is Sacred, The Family is Cherished." Dr Phil Boyle

Dr Phil Boyle graduated in Medicine from Galway University in 1992 and later qualified as a General Practitioner. He is a member of the Irish College of General Practitioners and is currently president of the International Institute for Restorative Reproductive Medicine. He developed NeoFertility in 2016 after 20 years' experience with NaProTechnology Fertility treatment.

Dr. Boyle is the founder and director of **NeoFertility** and is a co-founder of the Chart NeoFertility app. He has helped many couples achieve successful pregnancies, many after years of infertility, repeated miscarriage, and failed IVF.

Dr Boyle is married to Evanna and is father to 4 children aged 12-21 years. NeoFertility is a Dublin, Ireland-based fertility clinic helping couples conceive naturally by finding and treating the underlying reasons for fertility problems. The service helps couples have babies with love and science. The approach to fertility treatment is simple: if you have a fertility problem, there always has to be a reason. Identifying and treating those specific reasons will resolve the problem and restore your reproductive health. Neofertility embraces a restorative approach to reproductive healthcare, by addressing the root cause of fertility issues in order to restore balance to the woman's cycle and to improve the chances of conceiving naturally. Kay is a Creighton Model Practitioner and has taught more than 1,200 women & couples in the Creighton Model System to enable them to grow their families while cooperating with the teachings of the Catholic Church & Humane Vitae. Kay is part of the NaProTechnology team of healthcare professionals who have supported thousands of couples struggling with the pain of infertility or miscarriage, while on their journey to parenthood. Kay is a Certified FertilityCare Educator and sits on the Faculty of St Joseph's Practitioner Education Program supervising during the training and certification process.

In 2020, Kay and her husband John established St Brigid's Centre for Female Health & Fertility in Kells, Co. Meath where Fertility Care Centres of Ireland & The NaPro Technology Clinic is based. It is a "one-stop shop" for all mainstream female health services including Creighton Model education for teens and adults, menopause transition, counselling, breast-feeding support, pelvic floor physiotherapy and more.

Dr Kirsty Chapman, NaproTechnology Ireland

Kirsty Chapman grew up in South Africa and graduated with a Bachelor of Medicine and Surgery from the University of Cape Town in 2012 and qualified as a General Practitioner. She, her husband Henry and their three daughters moved to Ireland in 2021, where she joined a GP practice in Kells.

Kirsty trained with the St. Paul VI Institute in Omaha, Nebraska to practice NaproTechnology as a FertilityCare Medical consultant. She is currently a member of the International Institute

for Restorative Reproductive Medicine and of the American Academy of Fertility Care Professionals. NaproTechnology is a comprehensive women's health science, faithful to the teachings of the Catholic Church, that works with a woman's cycle to diagnose and treat reproductive health issues and restore normal fertility.

Kirsty currently divides her time between her GP practice and St. Brigid's Centre for Female Health and Fertility in Kells, Co. Meath. Kirsty, Henry and the girls were delighted to welcome a baby brother to the family last year.



Bernadette Cunningham - Natural Family Planning Teacher Association of Ireland Bernadette Cunningham lives in Belfast, N Ireland. She is married to Paul and has two grown-up children and four grandchildren. She retired after thirty-five years teaching Science and Home Economics in post-primary education. She then trained to become a pre-marriage facilitator with Accord and worked for many years with couples preparing for marriage.

Having had difficulties with her own fertility, including miscarriages, she has a keen interest in this aspect of life and became involved with NFPTAI. She undertook the course that led to her becoming a tutor for the Association. She now teaches the future teachers of NFP, particularly focusing on the practical aspects of charting.

Dr John Kehoe - Irish Catholic Doctors Association

Dr Deirdre Gleeson, Natural Family Planning Teacher Association of Ireland

Dr Deidre Gleeson is the Medical Director and Specialist Occupational Health Physician OHP at the Medwise clinic, Naas. Dr Gleeson is qualified in general practice and occupational medicine. She is a Member of the Irish College of General Practitioners, a Fellow of the Faculty of Occupational Medicine and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians in Ireland. In 2010, Dr Deirdre Gleeson founded the Medwise Calcutta Project to sponsor the education and welfare of street children in Calcutta / Kolkata. Dr Gleeson regularly travels to India to oversee and assist the project. In 2011, Dr Gleeson studied fertility awareness with the NFPTAI and later became the course director. Dr Gleeson delivers workshops on fertility and reproductive health to women and young girls from the slums of Calcutta/ Kolkata.



Dr Maureen O'Carroll, FRCPI, FRCR

Dr Maureen O'Carroll is a retired Consultant Radiologist who worked in Letterkenny General Hospital, Co Donegal. Dr O'Carroll is a Fellow of The Royal College of Radiologists and a Fellow of the Royal College of Physicians in Ireland. In 1996 Dr O'Carroll attended the NFP Teacher Training Course in Liverpool run by Mrs Wyn Worthington, obtained the NFPTA Certificate and met Dr Anna Flynn. In Oct 1997 she became Secretary of the NFPTAI. Under the direction of Wyn Worthington, NFP Teacher Training Courses took place in Ireland, in Letterkenny, Sligo, Cavan, and Derry. Dr O'Carroll edited Dr Anna Flynn's and Wyn Worthington's NFP Teaching Materials which are now printed in two volumes (i) The Manual and (ii) The Workbook and which were first used in the NFP Teacher Training Courses in Monaghan (2010) and in The Rotunda Hospital, Dublin (2011). Dr O'Carroll retired from the NFPTAI in 2014. The FEDRA group of EIFLE/IEEF used Dr O'Carroll's work as the basis for the NFP Teacher Training Course theoretical manual now in its 3rd edition and used by NFP programs throughout Europe.

7. Knock

Knock, Co Mayo is Ireland's Eucharistic and Marian International shrine and the heart of Catholic faith in modern Ireland. On a wet evening on 21st August 1879 about 25 people from the tiny village of Knock witnessed a silent vision of Our Lady with St Joseph, St John the Evangelist and The Lamb of God upon the altar at the gable-end of the parish church for over 2 hours. The visionaries were aged between 5 years and 74 years. Fifteen of them later gave evidence at the subsequent official church enquiries in 1879 and 1936 which found their evidence to be trustworthy and satisfactory.

Many theologians have pondered the rich symbolism of the Knock apparition. The presence of Our Lady reflects the deep Marian devotion of the Irish people. St Joseph is present as the protector of the Holy Family and the Church. St John comes as a preacher and reflects the people's strong Christian faith and devotion to the church and sacraments. The Lamb of God upon the altar symbolises the mystery of The Holy Mass and The Eucharist. The vision at Knock occurred at a time of great hardship for the Irish people and brought them comfort and sustained them in their faith. Today Knock is recognised by the catholic church as an international Eucharistic and Marian shrine that welcomes over 1.5 million pilgrims every year who come to pray for the intercession of Our Lady, St Joseph and St John and to do homage to The Lamb of God.

Knock Shrine management has kindly offered conference delegates a complimentary tour of the Knock Museum and Knock Shrine Creation Walk, from 3.30pm to 5pm. Places are limited and should be booked through Eventbrite.

At Knock Museum you will discover the unique and fascinating story of Knock – covering 140 years of history – and find out why more than 1 million people make the journey to Knock Shrine each year. Knock Museum is accredited to the Museum Standards Programme of Ireland. The new 'Creation Walk' at Knock Shrine weaves its way through the meandering pathways that have been newly developed throughout the mature grounds at Knock Shrine. The prayerful walk consists of 30 stops that explain the evolution of our planet. Along these leafy pathways, there are opportunities to stop and prayerfully reflect on God's Creation. The walk is approximately 0.5km in length and is a peaceful, contemplative space in which to pray, to reflect and to reconnect.
